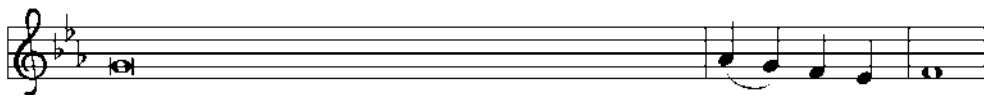

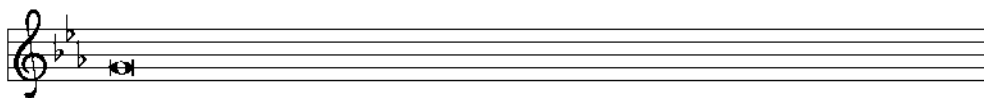

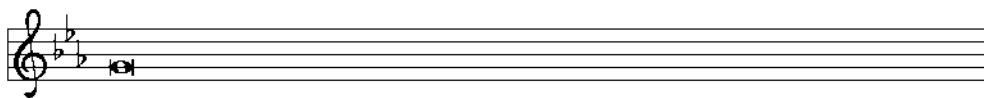

NICENE CREED

Let us confess our faith with the words of the Nicene Creed.
