This year we've seen ourselves gain better traction within the continued COVID-19 Pandemic. We've begun to be more active (once again) in the community. Our Youth and Confirmation Programs are stronger than they have been in years. We continue to reach out and proclaim the Gospel of God to a people who yearn to hear of its promise and hope.

We get to live into the promise that we *are* enough, that we *are* loved, that we *are* forgiven. That is a message that we all need to hear, and that is a message that we all get to share with those around us.

Of course, as we head into the season of Advent, there are still those times when the shadows seem to press in on us – as they did leading up to Jesus' birth. That is what Advent feels like for me. A time of longing for the hope that is to come. That faith to cling to the promise of what God has set forth for the world. That opportunity to see the falling and failing of the world (and ourselves) and still breathe the hope of God.

May our Advent and Christmas hope continue to move us to see God at work, to cling to God's promise, and to live out the ministry of God. We *get* to do this work *because* God has claimed us as worthy and enough.

Blessed Advent and Happy Christmas to all of you, my sisters and brothers – my friends in Christ.


