
Redeemer Lutheran Men in Mission News for January

As we enter into this second month of the new year, there's something that always gets me excited about ministry in our little corner of the kingdom of God – the work of the Endowment Team at Redeemer.

As y'all might remember, we were gifted a very generous and substantial financial gift from Legrand Amick a few years ago. His gift helped us pay off our mortgage, support numerous ministries around the area, and renovate some aspects of our building and services at Redeemer. It was truly a 'once-in-a-lifetime' gift.

The most lasting aspect of Legrand's gift, however, was the establishment of our Endowment for Mission Fund. Each year members, who we elect to that team, get to receive numerous grant proposals and then get to disburse funds from the Endowment to help those numerous ministries.

Those funds have helped send members of Redeemer to camp for reduced or no cost, it has helped provide needed food and supplies for those in Israel and Palestine during holy months, those experiencing homelessness in and around Findlay Park in Columbia, SC have found a community of faith that has blossomed through the Endowment fund. Organizations and ministries like Boy's Farm, Newberry College, Camp Kinard, The Literacy Council, Boundary Street Elementary, and so many more have been helped because of this gift.

It is a truly wonderful gift that continues – and will continue – to help so many ministries in and around the community and world.

Every year in February and March, the Endowment Team discerns – through prayer, discussion, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit – where the money accrued through the interest of the Endowment Fund might go to support greater and deeper faith formation.

As a reminder to us all, the Endowment Fund is completely separate from our Congregational Budget. The offerings you graciously give to the church continues to support the day-to-day mission and life of Redeemer. The money in the Endowment Fund is not, nor is it ever, used for the general fund and budget of the church.

I look forward to hearing about those new stories of impact and faith that are shared by those recipients. I ask each of us to be in prayer for our Endowment Team, that their choices — though not easy — are guided by the Spirit to best serve those in need around the community and world!

May we be inspired by the numerous ministries supported by the Endowment Fund to invest ourselves and our times in the life, ministry, and service of God at Redeemer in our respective communities!

Thanks be to God for the gift to serve!
