## Happy March everyone!

We've begun the season of Lent with a wonderful Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper & Impromptu Talent Show followed by the holy and penitential service of Ash Wednesday. That time of year that we recognize that we are indeed finite – we are just dust – but, that God is infinite and breathes into our dusty selves and gifts us new life. The season of Lent begins with reality and promise. It is a beautiful, humble, and holy time.

Throughout the season of Lent we try to center ourselves on God's presence in our lives while also centering God's love in our own lives. It is something that is easier said than done, unfortunately. We are prone to looking at the nearest shiny object like a dog who catches a glimpse of movement out of the corner of their eyes, and no matter how hard we 'tug' to get that dog's attention, it stubbornly looks to that 'new' and inconsequential thing.

We do it, too. The latest fads, our appearances, our stuff, averting our eyes from tragedy and oppression, staying silent when non-helpful (and more often than not hurtful) things are said about others, the belief that we are not enough, and more always seem to hold our attention far greater than God's love and promise. Perhaps we don't hear it enough? Maybe we feel we've 'heard it all before' and it doesn't quite 'stick' with us as much as it used to.

And yet, those promises remain. That love of God – throughout our lives and especially in the season of Lent – sticks with us despite our actions and fickle attention spans. Lent offers us an opportunity to breathe, pause, and focus.

To breathe in God's spirit and love. To pause the business that life ushers our way. To focus on God's presence with us always.

You might give something up during this season, you might take something on as an added discipline. You might feel like you're just trying to keep your head above water. Whatever you hope and pray to do – know this – God is with you. Regardless. Always. Forever.

Remember that during this season of Lent and throughout your life. God is with you. God loves you. God forgives you. Always. There is nothing that can take that love and presence from you or any of us. Why? Because God's love and stubbornness for us was shown in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ our Lord – the Word made flesh who came to be with us, to pull us towards God's love that has always been with us. To remind us that we are enough.

Know that you are enough. Always. Amen.




