Old Business

Roof Information/ Congregation Letter –Ben Bowers has spoken with South State Bank regarding loan information. Per the bank, the church should be able to receive a loan, but the interest rates would be 6-7%. Proposal made to council regarding the roof would be to pause on sending out the Congregation Letter and go back to the property committee for a secondary quote and assessment of the roof to include timing and full accounting of projected cost and need of complete roof replacement. All in favor.

Audit committee – Colony Lutheran Church and our church members would be each other's audit committees regarding finances. 2 finance committee members have agreed so far; awaiting on more members to join the audit committee.

Waldorf Montessori School – Ran by Lane Joiner. Established in 2017. Currently looking for bigger space. Current enrollment is 10 confirmed for next year with possibility of more. Grade levels are K5-3rd grade. Looking to add preschool but unable to have it on Main Street due to zoning. Current school day is 9-1 meeting Monday-Thursday. Start the week after Labor Day until the week before Memorial Day with holidays off (September to May). Currently provide snacks and students bring their own lunches. Would never have more than 20 students enrolled. Students are enrolled as home school students. Have their own liability insurance and follows the school no matter what building they use. Liability insurance does not cover teachers to drive students around. Students sign wavier forms for any activities. Max rent they could pay us would be \$400 per month. Latest date needed for a response from Council would need to be June 19. Would need 2 classrooms and potential common space. Ben Bowers made a motion to deny the request and seconded by Dr. John Green – all in favor of denying their request.

New Business

Staff Discussions – Gayle Lindley retiring July 31, 2023 as choir director. Need a search team to find a new choir director. Worship and Music committee to lead us in the right direction.

Breaking down sections from the constitution – tabled for next meeting

GSB Fundraising Stewardship Campaign – May 23rd at 11am via Zoom would be the first meeting to start the Stewardship Campaign. Pastor Matt Titus, Ben Bowers, and Nikki Chapman would be attending. Motion made to begin with GSB Fundraising Stewardship. Motion made by Chelsea Ellisor seconded by Faith Felix. 10 in favor, 1 abstained with regard to timing of the launch of campaign.

State Walk/Bike Trails Summit to have two individuals from Greenville who are biking through to tent camp in the overflow parking lot on Johnstone. Motion made by Huger Caughman, seconded by Ben Bowers. All in favor.

Executive Session – Motion made to go into executive session by Chelsea Ellisor and seconded by Pastor Matt Titus. All in favor. Motion made to go out of executive session by Ben Bowers and seconded by Faith Felix. All in favor.
