Call to Order

Welcome

Members Present – Pastor Matt Titus, Nikki Chapman, Chelsea Ellisor, Annette Belcher, Kristin Caughman, Dr. John Green, Huger Caughman, Mary Alex Kopp, Ben Bowers Members present on Zoom – Arlo Hill, Faith Felix, Chad Cary, Kathy Riggin

Reports

Pastor – Pastor Matt – John Whiteside's funeral. Upcoming funeral of Dean Mayer this coming Wednesday. Member contact/visits – 65 with non-member contacts – 100.

1853 Committee - Chad Cary - Successful homecoming and working on Directory stuff.

Community Compassion – Chelsea Ellisor, Faith Formation – Arlo Hill, – no report

Endowment Committee – Bob Montgomery – Been able to share over 40 grants equaling over \$340,000. Balance in the Endowment fund remains over \$3 million. 8.3% growth over the past 5 years from the original balance to where we are now.

Family and Social Fellowship – Kathy Riggin – Took food to Whiteside and helped with food for Sunday after Homecoming service. Will assist the family of Mayers.

Finance Committee/Treasurer – Dr. John Green – Worked through projected budgets for the new year. For the month of August, we were in the negative for \$9620.52.

Property Committee – Huger Caughman, Sr. – Roof & Steeple lighting – conference call with the roofer & electrician. Steeple lighting will cost around \$13,000 – Need council approval – Motion brought forward from committee and council approved to use \$13,000 ish to repair the lights on the steeple. Life Expectancy list for major appliances is still being worked on. Leak in boiler room – Working on this. Water heater in the boiler room appears to be leaking and will be checked and repair/replace. Windows/siding on FLC – waiting on numbers from Newberry Glass for replacement windows. After windows are replaced, we will look into siding repair/replacement. Signage – This has been done. Drain in the flat roof possibly clogged that will need to be looked at.

Stewardship Committee— Ben Bowers – New member celebration was successful with a Thrivent donation of \$250 plus generous donations from members. 23 testimonials received during the New Member Celebration regarding what do you love about the church/what drew you to the church, etc.

Worship and Music – Mary Alex Kopp - After reviewing applications and having interviews for choir director, the committee has submitted a recommendation for Nicholas Shumate to council. Currently the choral director at Chapin High School, previous experience at different ministries in the area, and strong ties to Newberry College. He has a master's degree in choral conducting. Starting salary request \$25,000 which falls under current rate for choir directors. Motion made that no decision be made at this council meeting and this will be discussed at top priority next council meeting. Motion made by Ben Bowers, seconded by Kathy Riggin – All in favor. Temple talk will be given to the congregation by Nikki Chapman and Huger Caughman Jr this Sunday.

Youth – Faith Felix Liaison – Aubrey and Pastor Matt are talking about joining with Central UMC and Summer Memorial for monthly Youth group beginning October 1 at Central UMC. Lutheran Youth Day was Saturday at Newberry College. Youth Hall updates continue.

Staff – Annette Belcher – We have met with all the Staff and sent our request to Finance. Continue to discuss finding replacement for Woody who plans to stay on until 2026.

President – Nikki Chapman – Thank you notes have been sent out to the congregation thanking them for their help. Have also been assisting with Youth Hall repairs.
