······ A Note from Pastor Matt ······

Grace and peace to each of you!

Here we are in May – nearly halfway through the year already. Time seems to be moving fast.

This month brings so many things to celebrate: graduates in cap and gown, the joyful approach of Pentecost, the blooming of new love (we look forward to celebrating the weddings of Vanessa Harshaw & Austin Bercume and Aubrey Guyton & Gunner Cisko this month), and the continued celebration of Easter's triumphant promise.

And through it all, we center our lives in God's grace and goodness. It was in that spirit that I witnessed something especially beautiful this past month.

On Easter Sunday, one of our youngest members – Clyde Miller – served as the Bible bearer for worship. First of all, he did an excellent job. It's no small thing to do something new and public in front of a church full of people – on the biggest day of the church year no less. But it was the way Clyde held that Bible that truly moved me.

He clung to it—tightly, reverently, almost fiercely. Now to be fair, our pulpit Bible is not light; it has some weight to it, literally and symbolically. But what struck me most was the way he carried it—with dignity, grace, and determination. It was a moment that whispered, *this is how we carry the Word of God*.

Not as an idol, not as a burden, but as something worth holding close. Something that reminds us: *you are loved, you are seen, and I am with you always*.

This is what it looks like to cling to hope. To hold onto the promises of God with everything we've got. That image of Clyde, holding tight to the Word, stayed with me.

So, as we step into this season of celebration, of endings and beginnings, of love and light and learning – may we hold fast to the Word given to us in Christ Jesus. The risen One who calls us beloved. The One who sees us, forgives us, and sends us out.

Hold that Word tightly in your heart – and then live it out boldly with your words and your actions, every single day.



..... Did You Know?



This is a new column in *The Redeemer Reader* where we plan to share information about the church, its history, the liturgy, the specific appointments within the church, and much more. If you have questions that you would like answered in this column, please notify the church office.

Redeemer has a collection of banners that were made by various members of Redeemer in addition to those that were made by Alice Pollock of West Columbia. Currently on display are two of our Easter banners-one with a butterfly superimposed on a golden background symbolizing the resurrection and new birth, and the other that has various colored tabs and other Easter symbols on it. During Lent you may have noticed two other banners were used. One was purple, has a tau cross with a serpent on it, and includes an excerpt of scripture from John 3. The other banner used during Lent was used on Palm Sunday through Maundy Thursday. It has the same scarlet, unbleached linen, and black scheme as the paraments and features a cross with a crown of thorns.

In Lutheranism, the Easter season, a time of celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ, is a 50-day period following Easter Sunday and concluding on Pentecost Sunday. It's not just a single day, but a season of joy and thanksgiving for new life in Christ. This season is marked by the color white, signifying purity and rejoicing.

Key aspects of the Easter season in Lutheranism:

- The Easter season lasts for 50 days, from Easter Sunday to Penetcost Sunday.
- It's a time of rejoicing and feasting, reflecting the good news of Christ's resurrection and the victory over death.
- The liturgical color for the Easter season is white, symbolizing purity, holiness, glory, and joy.
- The season emphasizes the resurrection, new life, and the power of Christ's victory over sin and death.
- Lutheran churches often incorporate special Easter hymns, prayers, and readings during the season.
