

..... Did You Know?



Our Sunday worship services consist of four distinct parts: Gathering, Word, Meal, and Sending. This month, we are going to discuss the Gathering. We begin with Confession and Forgiveness or Thanksgiving for Baptism (during the Easter season). Next is the Gathering Hymn which often reflects the theme or season of the day. The hymn is followed by the Kyrie which comes from Greek *kyrie eleison* meaning "Lord, have mercy". Some may remember in older hymnals, the Kyrie was often a back and forth response of "Lord, have mercy.

Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy." In the red *Service Book and Hymnal* (1958), the Kyrie took the format we find most common today. It is a translation from the 10th century plainsong translated from Latin *cantus planus*.

The Canticle of Praise has two options more commonly known as the Gloria in Excelsis or Worthy is Christ. The introduction to the Gloria is derived from Luke 2: 14. There are other stanzas of acclamation that include addresses to God the Father, God the Son, and God the Spirit. The Gloria is also from 10th century plainsong. Worthy is Christ was introduced with the green *Lutheran Book of Worship* in 1978. It uses a repetition of "This is the feast of victory for our God, alleluia" throughout. The other stanzas are derived from hymns in the book of Revelation and unite themes from Passover and Easter.

After the Canticle of Praise, comes the Greeting which is typically, "The Lord be with you" followed by "And also with you." In the SBH, the response was "And with thy spirit" which is derived from Latin *et cum spiritu tuo*. The Prayer of the Day follows the Greeting and is very closely aligned with the theme for the day. At Redeemer, we pray the Prayer of the Day together.
