······ A Note from Pastor Matt ······

Grace and peace to you, my friends!

As I write this, I'm in a quiet moment during a break at Lutheridge, right in the heart of our Kairos Confirmation week. The theme for this week is Baptism, and what a joy it's been! We've explored how baptism is not just a past event, but a living promise — that we are called, claimed, and sent by God through the waters that wash over us with grace.

One of the most moving parts of the week came on Wednesday, when our theme turned to rest. Yes, rest. A word that feels both comforting and, if we're honest, a little uncomfortable. Campers were invited to reflect on what rest looks like in their lives. Their answers were thoughtful and heartfelt: naps, sports, making music, reading, playing with pets. But then came the follow-up question: Is rest difficult for you? That one gave them pause.

And it's no surprise – most of them said yes. Rest is hard. Their lives, like ours, are full. Constant motion, constant connection, constant expectation. Many of us carry the weight of thinking that rest is somehow a sign of weakness, or that if we're not constantly producing something, we're falling behind.

But Scripture tells a different story. Jesus took naps—yes, even in a storm-tossed boat. And in the very beginning, God rested on the seventh day—not because God was tired, but to show us that rest is part of the rhythm of creation itself.

Rest is holy. Rest is faithful. Rest is necessary.

So as we make our way through the thick of summer – and the heat that comes with it-I want to encourage you to make time for rest. Real rest. The kind that restores your soul and reconnects you with the God who made you. That might look like a quiet walk, a good book, painting, prayer, or even a glorious nap in the AC.

However you rest, know this: it doesn't make you lazy. It makes you whole. It honors the God who created you, claimed you, and still calls you to life.

So take a breath. Rest well. And know that you are loved.

······ Did You Know? ······



Last month, we discussed the Gathering part of our worship service. This month, we will examine the Word section. During this part of worship, God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song. For the past several years, we mainly using The have been Narrative Lectionary (workingpreacher.org if you want to read more) in addition to The Revised Common Lectionary which has been part of our worship resources for decades now. During this time, our pattern usually includes a reading (Old and/or New

Testament), a children's message (Lil' Lutheran Talk), a gospel reading, a sermon, a hymn of the day, the creed, the prayers, and the peace. The hymn of the day is usually closely aligned with the scripture readings. The creed changes based on the season of the church year. The two creeds we use are the Nicene Creed and the Apostles' Creed. The Council of Nicea convened in 325 and one of its main products was the Nicene Creed. So we have 1700 years of history there. The Apostles' Creed is likely a little older, but it has evolved over the centuries. It is believed that the version we use now comes from the 7th or 8th century. The prayers of the church are varied and offer prayers for the church, the world, synodical concerns, local concerns, and we also include a time of silence where people can name petitions aloud or silently. After the prayers conclude, we exchange the peace. There are many forms in which the peace may be exchanged, mostly due to people's different levels of comfort. This is a time to reconcile ourselves with each other as we prepare for the *Meal*, which we will discuss next month.
