Grace and peace to you, my friends!

The start of a new school year is upon us—and in our house, that's no small thing. ······ Did You Know? ·····

The last two months, we have taken a closer look at *Gathering* and *Word* as part of our worship service. This month, we are going to examine the *Meal*. In our pattern for worship, *Meal* is described as *God feeds us with the presence of Jesus Christ*. At Redeemer, we receive the Lord's Supper every Sunday morning. In this portion of the worship service, we receive an offering that is used for the church's mission and ministry as a sign of giving of our whole selves in grateful response for all of God's gifts. During the reception of the offering, one of our choirs offers a Musical Offering that is closely connected with the theme of the day on the liturgical calendar.

As these gifts are brought forward, our crucifer receives them and offers a short prayer of blessing as these gifts are presented to God. Pastor sets the table and prepares for Holy Communion. Before the Lord's Supper is served, we hear the words of the Great Thanksgiving, Preface (again tied to the liturgical calendar), and Holy, Holy (...we praise your name and join their unending hymn). (This text is referenced in Isaiah 6: 3 and Revelation 4: 8.)

Thanksgiving at the Table includes the Words of Institution. The grace of God's gift is always proclaimed in Jesus' own words of command and promise at the table. The thanksgiving always concludes with the Lord's prayer (Matthew 6: 9-13 and Luke 11: 2-4). The translation we most often use is derived from King James. You will notice other translations interchange trespasses with sins or debts.

Following the Lord's Prayer, we are issued an invitation to share in the Lord's Supper. At Redeemer, with our free standing altar and altar rail, we are able to gather as a family to receive the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. In these gifts, God forgives us and nourishes us for mission. Sometimes, we sing a communion hymn during the distribution. Otherwise, we have soft communion music that is played which allows time for reflection and meditation on what God has done for us. Following communion, the elements are covered and we have a short Prayer after Communion which gives thanks to God and implores for us to be strengthened for service to others and to proclaim God's redeeming love to the world.
