······· A Note from Pastor Matt ······

September always feels like a season of beginnings. School athletics are in full swing. College classes have started. Football is back on the gridiron. And here at Redeemer, confirmation classes are starting once again! It's a joy to walk with our youth and community through these fresh starts.

Not long ago, one of my students at Newberry College stopped me after class. We had been working through some of the early stories in Genesis, and they said, "Pastor Matt, I feel a little lost—what can I do to be better prepared?" My advice was simple: read the stories.

Of course, reading alone won't give every answer. These stories come from an ancient world, shaped by oral traditions and the questions of their time. But reading them opens the door to something even more important: seeing how God has always been present with creation.

That's exactly what our confirmation students will be doing as we begin again with Genesis and continue building on this great story of faith we share. In worship, too, we'll be returning to the beginning of God's story as the lectionary cycles back to Genesis. Each week we'll hear again how God's story is still unfolding—and how we remain a part of it.

It is good to know these stories. Not so that we can master every detail, but so that we can wonder, ask questions, and grow together. In faithful conversations and in love, we keep learning what it means that God has been with us from the very beginning.

We get to see the presence of God through the earliest stories of our faith, through the struggles of God's faithful people (those same struggles we as modern faithful still fall into), and through the model, life, and love of Christ our Lord who points us back to God's presence and love that has always been with us!

May we continue to walk together in hearing, reading, and sharing these stories of faith. Amen.

..... Stewardship Snippet

For the past two months, we have looked at our overall giving to Redeemer as a parish family. This month, we are going to examine some questions related to Stewardship.

Question: What portion of my time, talent and treasure should I give?

Answer: Giving of our time, talent, and treasure mainly involves a change of attitude about giving. It's important to think in terms of giving in gratitude to God, of considering how blessed you are, of using your gifts and talents for the good of others. Once you have this change of attitude, you will be able to more readily determine, through prayer and planning, the portion of your time, talent, and treasure that you will give. In the area of time and talent, many individuals commit a certain number of hours each week to prayer and charitable activities. That prayer can be by yourself, with your family, or with others. Those charitable activities can include working in our parish, working with various community agencies, or working with an individual in need. In the area of treasure, some Christians choose the norm of giving 10 percent of their treasure. Some, because of circumstances, give more than that. Others might start at two, three or four percent. When you are at peace about the size of your gift, when you do not find yourself making excuses for its size, when you know in your heart that you have been completely honest with God and yourself, then your gift is the proper size.

Question: How can we make our fellow parishioners and our families more aware of Stewardship?

Answer: In our parish, we use the bulletin, newsletter, and temple talks to talk about being good stewards. We highlight the various ways to use our time and talent in our parish and community. The next time you work at GAAP or Manna House, invite someone to come work with you. The next time you have a little free time, come volunteer in the church office or help with tasks around the church campus. Share stories of generosity. Encourage others to fully support the mission and ministries of Redeemer.

Question: How important is it for children to be taught about stewardship of time, talent, and treasure? Answer: It is very important and the earlier we can begin teaching them, the better. We teach children while they are very young about Jesus, about prayer and about love. We take them to church every week. We help them understand the difference between their "needs" and their "wants." These are all important parts of the Christian life. Giving of ourselves is also an important part of our Christian life, and we need to start teaching children the meaning of giving while they are young. Parents are encouraged to take a child along with them when they visit shut-ins or people in nursing homes. Our Christian Education Committee is providing an opportunity for our children to mail cards to others who are not actively attending Sunday School. Our Prayer and Care Class mails cards to sick parishioners and our college students. Our Social Ministry Committee collects food and supplies for GAAP and Manna House. All of these are ways to help teach children about their stewardship of time, talent, and treasure.

"The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work." ~2 Corinthians 9: 6 - 8

Over the past three months, we have looked at the parts of our worship service: *Gathering, Word,* and *Meal*.


This month, we will examine the last part of the service, *Sending*. The *Sending* is where we are sent out into the world to continue our participation in God's mission. With the blessing of God, we go out to live as Christ's body in the world.

The Sending portion of the service begins with the Sending of Communion which is included if communion is taken from worship to those who are homebound or infirm. We have done this at different times in the life of our church. Next, is the Blessing. At Redeemer, we use a Sung Blessing each week that is a call and response. The Sending Song follows the blessing and is often tied to the scripture passages or is a song of sending, rejoicing, and praise to God. At the end of our service before the closing organ voluntary, we are dismissed with a short recap of the theme of the day which is followed by, "Go in peace, Thanks be to God!"

Confirmation is coming soon! All those in SIXTH grade and up who have not completed Confirmation requirements are encouraged to attend. This year we will hear, learn, and grow into the stories of our faith as we move through the Old Testament. The fun begins on September 14 in the Youth Hall.
