..... A Note from Pastor Matt

Grace and peace to each of you as we enter this final month of 2025.

What a year it has been! We've had so much to celebrate as our community continues to grow in faith, service, and welcome. We've strengthened our outreach in Newberry, supported ministries near and far through our Endowment Fund, welcomed new leaders into important roles, and—most importantly—remained a place where God is at work and where all are truly welcome.

This year we welcomed 10 people into the congregation through baptism and affirmation of baptism. We confirmed 10 youth in June as they completed their Confirmation journey. We celebrated the weddings of five couples—with one more coming mid-month. Our Endowment Fund once again dispersed generous support to ministries both within Redeemer and throughout our community. It has truly been a year rich with God's blessings.

What fills me with the most gratitude, though, is the steady, faithful work of welcome, grace, hospitality, and love that defines Redeemer. I'm thankful every day to serve alongside people who look for God's presence in every person they meet. Ministry isn't always easy, but you consistently step into service with joy, compassion, and the kind of servant-hearted leadership Jesus models for us all. Thank you for showing Christ's love in all you do.

Of course, this year has also brought moments of mourning and goodbye. This month, we bless Aubrey as she completes her time as our Youth Director and steps into a new chapter – one with more family time on weekends and preparation for seminary as she pursues ministry in the ELCA as a deacon. We also remembered the saints among us who have died this year, giving thanks for their lives and the promise of the resurrection.

We marked milestones as well—celebrating ten years of ministry together as pastor and people (what a joy that has been!). And our wider church celebrated the election of a new Presiding Bishop of the ELCA, Rev. Yehiel Curry.

As we look ahead to 2026, there is much to anticipate. Here at Redeemer, we will continue living into our calling of radical welcome and hospitality. Within the South Carolina Synod, we will gather to elect a new bishop this summer. And looking even farther ahead, our youth and leaders are beginning to prepare for the 2027 ELCA Youth Gathering in Minnesota.

2026 is shaping up to be another wonderful year of ministry – and I thank God we get to walk into it together.

..... Did You Know?

When the new church opened, in 1965, it was equipped with broadcast equipment to connect with WKDK. It was originally housed in the storage sacristy under the organ's pipe chamber. The sound and lights were controlled from the back pew on the pulpit side. (Check it out - part of the seat lifts up where the controls were housed.) When the sound system was upgraded in the 1990s, the sound board was moved to the center of the balcony, and our broadcast capabilities were expanded to include a video recording system. Not only were we on the radio, we had a television presence on Newberry College's Channel 2. During the Growing in Grace, Building to Serve renovations to our campus in 2003, a "sound booth" was created that houses our broadcasting, lighting, and sound controls. We now broadcast live each Sunday and special services on our website (Box Cast), Facebook, and YouTube. We reach hundreds of viewers each week. This is a valuable ministry of our church and is completely staffed with volunteers.
